



Medical Campus Fact Sheet

Economic Impact

SSM Health Care of Wisconsin* & Dean Health System will be building a \$130 million community hospital campus in Janesville scheduled to open in 2010. SSMHC/WI will build the hospital and Dean, its physician partner, will build a new clinic as part of a physician office complex adjacent to the hospital.

The hospital and physician office complex are expected to provide approximately:

- 344 direct jobs in the community, plus an additional 155 indirect jobs.
- \$164 million in economic impact annually to the community, including approximately \$40 million in payroll and \$124 million in sales revenue.
- This project will be completed without state or federal funding.

Project Description

SSM Health Care of Wisconsin (SSMHC/WI) and Dean Health System Inc. (DHS) of Madison, WI, will build a new state-of-the-art hospital and physician office complex on a 50-acre site in Janesville, located at the southeast corner of the I-90 and Highway 11 interchange.

The campus will include a new 50-bed hospital – approximately 150,000 to 175,000 square feet. It will also include a new physician office building of approximately 120,000 square feet. The 50-acre site incorporates space for planned future growth of both the hospital and physician office complex.

The convenient location will allow easy access for patients coming from Janesville and other surrounding communities.
